

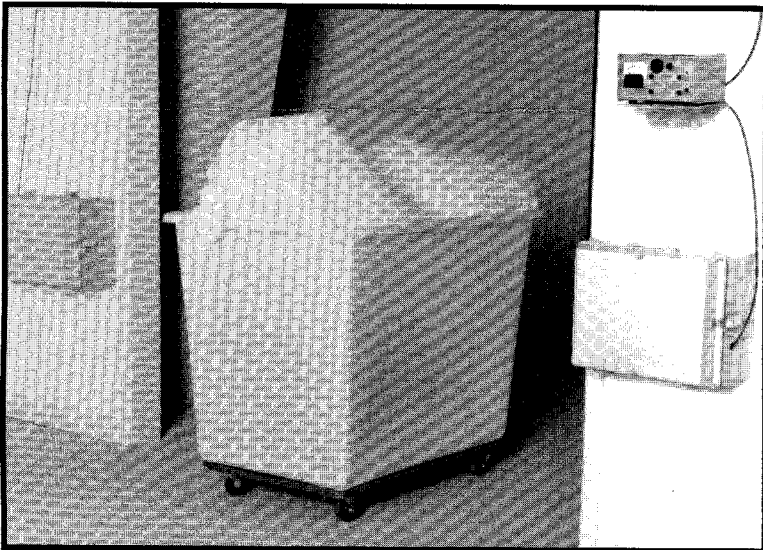

Model 3530 Waste Monitor

The Model 3530 Medical Waste Monitor is an analog ratemeter designed to detect low levels of radiation. The system consists of an analog ratemeter/counter and two lead-shielded 3" (dia.) by 1" (thick) sodium iodide (NaI) scintillation detectors with 25 foot cables.

The Model 3530 is powered by 120VAC, 50-60Hz and features a standard 120VAC duplex receptacle on the back panel for easy plug-in of alarm strobes or bells. An alarm lamp is located on the front panel and flashes to indicate an alarm. While in the alarm mode the system will emit a loud tone until the unit is reset. The 0-10 μ R/hr linear meterface is easy to read and allows for easy alarm setting.

The detector shielding is 0.75" thick lead which makes the system directional and reduces background radiation, therefore making the system more sensitive. The detectors can be purchased with or without weatherproof enclosures.

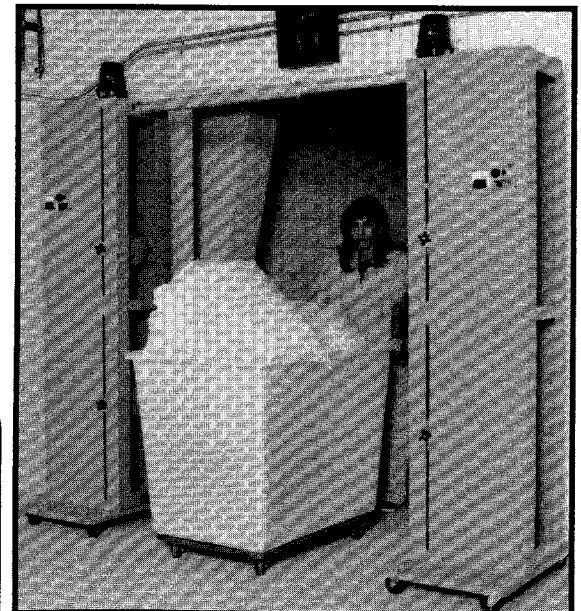
Model 3534 Waste Monitor System

The Model 3532 and 3534 Medical Waste Monitors are systems, with fixed portal geometry, that were designed to detect low levels of radiation. The Model 3534 consists of two analog ratemeters and four lead-shielded 3" (dia.) by 1" (thick) sodium iodide (NaI) scintillator detectors mounted in a portal frame. The Model 3532 has one ratemeter and two detectors. The height and angle of the detectors are adjustable. Width of the portal is adjustable. Detectors and cables are well protected inside the portal frame. System can be shipped fully assembled for easy installation.

MODEL 2929/43-10-1 REVISION

June 1994

Two revisions have been made to the Model 2929/43-10-1 Alpha/Beta-Gamma Scaler/Phoswich Scintillator. These revisions improve the overall efficiency of the counting system. The modifications will be made to all Model 2929's/43-10-1's returned to Ludlum Measurements, Inc. for repair/calibration and were effective for new instruments as of 8/18/94 — Model 2929's serial # 109556 and succeeding. Model 43-10-1's serial # PR 113231 and succeeding.

Model 2929 Amplifier/Discriminator Board Revision

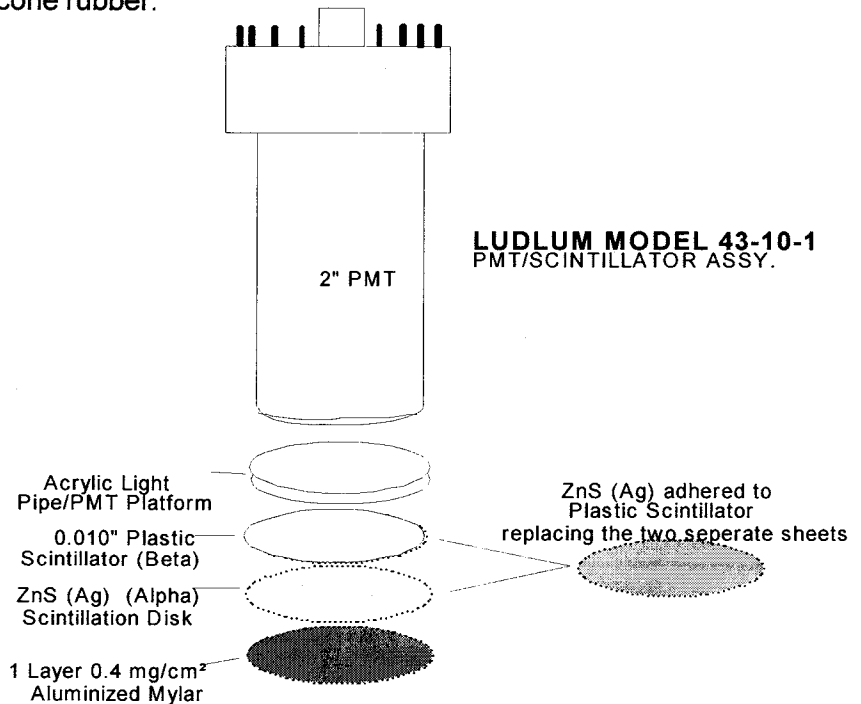
C21 on Amplifier/Discriminator Board # 5337-026 (refer to schematic and component layout drawings in the Instruction Manual) has been changed from a 0.01 F to a 0.047 F, 100 volt capacitor. This modification will improve (decrease) alpha source count cross-talk in the beta counting channel. This allows the detector to be operated at a higher operating voltage, therefore increasing the beta efficiency. The main restricting element in the count versus voltage plateau in the past was alpha count cross-talk in the beta channel (i.e. 10% alpha count in the beta channel) the restricting elements now will be beta background and/or beta count cross-talk in the alpha channel.

Model 43-10-1 Phoswich Scintillator Revision

The phoswich scintillator assembly has consisted of a 0.010" plastic scintillator for beta-gamma and a ZnS(Ag) disk for the alpha scintillator. These two scintillation disks have now been combined — the ZnS(Ag) is adhered to the plastic scintillator disk with a thin layer of white silicone rubber.

1. By removing the extra plastic disk in which the ZnS(Ag) was adhered to - less attenuation for low energy beta particles improving low energy beta efficiency.
2. Silicon rubber provides stable adhesive when cured and ZnS(Ag) is adhered securely alleviating "flaking" of the ZnS(Ag) powder during assembly and packaging of replacement disks.
3. Combining the two disks eliminates an extra component during assembly and repair.

LMI part # for the ZnS(Ag) / Plastic disk is 2142-118. The revision will be at no charge - add \$50.00 for Model 2929/43-10-1 calibration plus shipping — when the instrument is returned to LMI for modification.
